Neil Sanders, and his mom, Sandy Sanders are our "Family Members". Neil's father, Lt. Richard Sanders, of the Oakland Fire Department died while on duty January 15, 1997. Neil grew up knowing that he wanted to follow in his father's footsteps and became an Oakland Firefighter.

In March, Neil contacted us about a fundraiser he and another Oakland Firefighter, Roger Preto were putting together. They had decided to have a "Stickball Tournament" in the streets of Oakland. For those of you who don't know what stickball is...it's baseball with a stick instead of a bat, and is usually played in the streets. Neil managed to reserve Washington Street in Oakland, between 8th and 10th on Saturday May 8th for his tournament. Neil said that he was donating all of the proceeds to the Alameda County One Hundred Club. He expressed that the Club had been there for him and his Mom for all of his life and that he really wanted to do something to give back or pay it forward. Either way, it was sincere, heartfelt and generous. Neil had never organized a fundraiser before, so he had his work cut out for him. After contacting the City of Oakland and all the donors, sponsors and other key people, he was on his way to creating a very successful event!

Saturday May 8th arrived, and Jim Knudsen, Chairman of the 100 Club's Membership Committee, was there at the crack of dawn to set up the 100 Club's booth. Patty Goodman, our Family Liaison Chair, arrived with Neil's mom, Sandy, to find the streets blocked off and fire trucks scattered about in support of the event. There were many firefighters and their friends and families who came out in support of the event and to have fun. There were 8 teams of 10 players. Each team had its own theme and costume/tee shirt. 
